#### **Grade 8 Summer Reading Assignment**

To my incoming Grade 8 students,

Congratulations! You've made it through another academic year and can now look forward to a restful and relaxing summer before entering your FINAL year of elementary school. However, as I always tell you; first the work-then the play. It is always important to practice our skills, whether that be in training in sports or academics, so that we don't lose them over time.

Summer reading is an integral part of retaining and enhancing your reading, writing, and comprehension skills over the three month break. It is also a mandatory part of your education. Consequently, your summer reading assignment must be completed for a grade to be entered at the start of school in September. Below you will find a reading comprehension packet that will accompany your reading of the novel I have selected for you. The novel is called "Hatchet" by Gary Paulson. It was published way back in 1987 (ancient times, I know), but, like all good literature, its themes are timeless and have reached many different generations of readers.

The novel is about a 13 year old boy named Brian who is on his way to visit his father when the plane he is travelling in crashes in the wilderness. Brian must learn to survive the harsh environment alone as well as deal with the emotional challenges of his parents getting a divorce. It is a riveting story about adapting to change, persevering through difficult times, and the importance of relying on God through life's struggles and tribulations.

You must approach the reading of this book properly. You should read each chapter carefully, pause to reflect on what you read, then complete that chapter's section in the reading packet before moving to the next chapter. It is NOT advised to read the entire book and then go back and complete the entire packet as a whole as this is not the most effective way of gaining FULL comprehension of the text.

Students will be expected to turn in their summer reading packet on the **FIRST day of school** in September. We will be discussing the book as part of our first unit in Grade 8 Reading class. The packet will be graded out of a total of **70 marks** broken down as follows:

Section 1) Vocabulary Words and Definitions: 15 points (30 words/half a point each)

Section 2) Chapter Comprehension: 40 points (2 points each chapter+epilogue=20x2)

Section 3) Long answer writing prompt: 15 points ( grammar, punctuation, text citations)


Copies of the book belonging to MQP library will be handed out during the last week of school for students to take home. Students must bring the book back in the same shape it was sent home in or their summer reading assignment will not be graded. Students may purchase their own book online if they choose. I will also be providing a PDF version of the book online through Google Classroom if they prefer to read it electronically rather than hard copy. There is also a free online audio reading of the book available on Youtube and I will post the link in Google Classroom. The audio book should be listened to only AFTER reading the entire book. It is NOT a quick way to circumvent the actual practice of sitting down and reading all 192 pages of the book.

Simply put, there are no excuses for failing to read a book less than 200 pages over three months with individual copies/online versions provided to each student free of charge. Therefore, I expect this reading package to be fully completed to a standard expected of a student soon to be entering high school. #### Mary Queen of Peace Summer Math Assignment Summer 2025

#### Dear Parents,

We hope you all have a relaxing and enjoyable summer. While summer is a time for fun, we don't want our MQP students to lose any of the knowledge they obtained this school year. Research shows that the more time a child practices math skills the more they learn and remember. This summer your child will continue to have access to the IXL Math program online. Your support is essential. Encouraging your child to participate is important for a rewarding summer math program.

Your child is required to practice at least TWELVE (12) different SKILLS from their grade level in IXL. They should only complete skills within their grade level. For example, students coming to the 7th grade for the 2025-2026 school year should only work on 6th grade skills. Pick any letter topic (A to LL) and then pick TWELVE (12) different skills. You must get a SMART SCORE of 85 for each skill. Students coming to the 8th grade for the 2025-2026 school year should only work on 7th grade skills. Pick any letter topic (A to II) and then pick TWELVE (12) different skills. You must get a SMART SCORE of 85 for each skill.

This is a required summer assignment and a grade will be assigned at the beginning of the school year for their first quarter math grade based on the **Twelve (12)** skills completed on IXL. This assignment will be worth 102 points. The assignment window opens Friday, May 30, 2025 and must be completed by Friday, August 29, 2025 (IXL shuts down to prepare for the upcoming school year).

To check your child's work:

- Click the "Analytics" tab near the top of the webpage.
- Ensure that "Math" is the only subject selected.
- Ensure that the "Skill Grades" selected are 6th or 7th grade.
- Then, select "Date Range" and look near the bottom of the pull-down tab that says "Custom".
- The start date is May 30th, the end date is August 29th, 2025
